



GSM was created in 1983 to give Garland a major summer musical theatre program which allows professional artists through Actor's Equity Association to work with performers of all ages as part of a theatre training and professional production company.

Education has been a primary focus of the GSM since its inception. For 34 years, GSM has worked with the Dallas County Community College District. GSM first started the DCCCD partnership with Eastfield College in 1983. Each summer over 30 scholarships are given to students and teachers through this program. Since 1998 GSM has also had an ongoing partnership with Tarleton State University in their Theatre Intern Program. GSM is proud of its continuing partnership with Dallas Young Artists in their camp program which culminates with a superb production of *The Little Mermaid* on July 1-3.

There are so many people we want to thank including the GSM Board Members, the GSM Guild and our faithful and dedicated patrons, donors and season ticket holders. For 34 Seasons we have worked with hundreds of incredibly talented people! We are so proud to report that we currently have GSM Alumnae appearing in Broadway shows and touring with National Broadway companies.




