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

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
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#### <u>~In Loving Memory~</u> Paul E. Dutka June 26, 1962 - March 15, 2017



Paul graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 1984 with a Bachelor's degree in Music Education. He got his Master's degree in Music Performance from the highly regarded College of Music at the University of North Texas in 1989.

Paul was best known for his work in musical theater. He played about 150 different musicals. He first played with Garland Summer Musicals in 1998, and was part of the orchestra last season. At various times, he played every woodwind instrument from piccolo to contrabass clarinet, always eager to do extra chamber music of many kinds.

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
